## WHAT TO LOOK FOR – A LOOK BACK

**STREAKING SMITH:** Kansas City quarterback **ALEX SMITH** completed 16 of 22 passes (72.7 percent) for 162 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions for a 123.7 passer rating in the Chiefs' 34-20 win at Oakland.

Smith now has an active streak of 305 consecutive pass attempts without an interception, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Famer **BART STARR** (294) for the third-longest streak of consecutive pass attempts without an interception in NFL history.

**TOM TERRIFIC:** New England quarterback **TOM BRADY** passed for 312 yards and three touchdowns against Philadelphia in Week 13.

Brady, who now has 423 career touchdown passes, surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (420) for the third-most touchdown passes in NFL history. Only **PEYTON MANNING** (539) and **BRETT FAVRE** (508) have thrown more touchdown passes.

**DECEMBER TO REMEMBER:** New Orleans quarterback **DREW BREES** passed for 282 yards and three touchdowns against Carolina in Week 13.

Brees has 110 career touchdown passes in the month of December, tying Pro Football Hall of Famer **DAN MARINO** (110) for the third-most touchdown passes during the month in NFL history.

**WHAT TO LOOK FOR ON MNF:** One more note to keep in mind for tonight's *Monday Night Football* game between the Cowboys and Redskins ...

**CATCHING ON:** With two receptions on *Monday Night Football* at Washington, Dallas tight end **JASON WITTEN** (998) would join **TONY GONZALEZ** as the only tight ends in NFL history to have 1,000 career catches. Witten (33 years, 215 days old on Monday) would be the youngest tight end in NFL history to reach 1,000 career receptions (Gonzalez, 34 years, 197 days).

Arizona wide receiver **LARRY FITZGERALD** (32 years, 97 days old on Sunday), who had eight receptions for 55 yards in the Cardinals' 27-3 win at St. Louis, surpassed **ANDRE JOHNSON** (33 years, 163 days) as the youngest player to reach 1,000 career receptions in NFL history.
