LIVING LEGENDS: Arizona wide receiver **LARRY FITZGERALD** and Indianapolis running back **FRANK GORE** continue to etch their names in the NFL record book.

Fitzgerald led the Cardinals with 10 receptions for 98 yards and a touchdown in their Week 13 loss. He has 1,207 career catches and became the third player in NFL history to reach 1,200 receptions, joining Pro Football Hall of Famer **JERRY RICE** (1,549) and **TONY GONZALEZ** (1,325).

Fitzgerald, who played in his 214th career game, is the fastest player in NFL history to reach the milestone (Rice, 221 games and Gonzalez, 247).

Gore rushed for 61 yards in the Colts' Week 13 loss and has 13,697 career rushing yards. He surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famers LA DAINIAN TOMLINSON (13,684) and JEROME BETTIS (13,662) to move into fifth place on the NFL's all-time rushing list.

SAINTS ARE MARCHING: New Orleans running backs **ALVIN KAMARA** (126 scrimmage yards with two touchdowns) and **MARK INGRAM** (122 scrimmage yards with a touchdown) combined for 248 scrimmage yards and three touchdowns in the Saints' 31-21 win over Carolina in Week 13.

Kamara and Ingram have both recorded at least 100 scrimmage yards in the same game four times and are the first pair of running back teammates with four such games in a season since **ROGER CRAIG** and **WENDELL TYLER** of the 1985 San Francisco 49ers.

RECORD-SETTING RECEIVER: Pittsburgh wide receiver **ANTONIO BROWN** had eight catches for 101 yards and a touchdown in the Steelers' 23-20 win at Cincinnati on *Monday Night Football* last week.

Brown, who has 569 receptions since 2013, surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer **MARVIN HARRISON** (563 from 1999-2003) for the most catches by a player over any five-year span in NFL history.

LEGENDARY LANDRY: Miami wide receiver **JARVIS LANDRY** ranks third in the NFL with 80 receptions this season.

Landry, who entered the NFL as a second-round draft pick in 2014, is the only player in NFL history to have at least 80 receptions in each of his first four seasons.

CLUTCH WILSON: Seattle quarterback **RUSSELL WILSON** threw three touchdown passes, including one in the fourth quarter, in the Seahawks' 24-10 win over Philadelphia on *Sunday Night Football* last week.

Wilson has 15 fourth-quarter touchdown passes this season, tied with **ELI MANNING** (15 in 2011) for the most in a single season.

JETS SOARING: New York Jets quarterback **JOSH MC COWN** completed 26 of 36 passes (72.2 percent) for 331 yards with one touchdown and no interceptions for a 109.8 passer rating and rushed for two touchdowns in the team's 38-31 win over Kansas City last week.

McCown, who turned 38 years old in July, became the third player in NFL history with at least two rushing touchdowns in a single game at the age of 38 or older.

DOMINANT DUMERVIL: San Francisco linebacker **ELVIS DUMERVIL** recorded a sack in the 49ers' 15-14 win at Chicago last week. Dumervil ranks fourth among active players with 104.5 career sacks.

Dumervil's sack of Chicago rookie quarterback Mitchell Trubisky on Sunday marked the 50th different quarterback he has sacked in his 12-year NFL career. Dumervil is the fourth active player to have at least a half-sack against 50 different quarterbacks in his career.
